

DRESS AND GROOMING

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

- Boys and girls should wear their hair in a clean, neat, and well-groomed fashion. Hair should be worn in a fashion that is not covering the eyes. Unusual hairstyles (Mohawks, logos, manes, etc.) and colors that are not natural hair colors are prohibited. Hairstyles shall not, in the opinion of the administration, cause a safety hazard or cause a distraction to the educational process.
- Students must wear clothing, accessories, and undergarments in keeping with their gender. Boys may not wear earrings of any kind.
- Girls may wear no more than two earrings per ear. No student may have any visible piercings other than earlobes.
- All clothing must be clean and in good repair. Fashion damaged clothing will not be considered in good repair.
- Students must wear shoes, boots, or sandals.
- Students may not wear any apparel that contains advertising for alcohol, tobacco, or drugs.
- No obscene or suggestive slogans may be worn on clothing or accessories.
- No halter, tank, tube, muscle, or strapless tops may be worn. Bare midriff garments, see-through garments, and pajamas are not allowed.
- Hats, caps, and sunglasses are not to be worn in the building. Bandanas may not be worn at school or school functions.
- Boys must be clean shaven. No beards or mustaches may be worn.
- Appropriate shorts may be worn by students. Appropriate dresses/skirts may be worn by female students. To be considered appropriate the shorts or dresses/skirts should be in good taste and worn no shorter than the tips of the fingers as the student stands naturally and no shorter than mid-thigh. Pants, shorts, or skirts worn to sag below the tops of undergarments will not be allowed.
- Coaches and activity sponsors may require additional dress and appearance guidelines.
- Note: Additional guidelines may be set forth during the school year as deemed appropriate.
